- Glass Experts agree that glass does not decompose. However, because one of its main components is sand, the right junk removal companies will take any on your property to a recycling site.
- Miscellaneous Waste You may have multiple other items on your property that take a long time to decompose. For instance, it can take cigarette butts take up to 12 years, untreated lumber roughly 15 years, Styrofoam cups up to 50 years, plywood between one and three years, painted boards about 13 years, and batteries up to 100 years to decompose.
